

10th US-Japan Future Forum "Grape King of California – Kanaye Nagasawa"



-- Commemoration of the 150th Anniversary of Satsuma Students --

We are pleased to announce that "The 10th US-Japan Future Forum" is to be held on Friday, September 18th, 2015 at San Jose State University to discuss the future of the wine industry in the US and Japan, and to commemorate the 150th anniversary of the departure of the Satsuma students from Kagoshima, Japan to the UK. Six of the fifteen Satsuma students including Kanave Nagasawa came to the US in 1867 following Thomas Lake Harris, the religious leader of the Brotherhood of the New Life.

Nagasawa moved to Santa Rosa, California with Harris in 1875, to establish the Fountain Grove Winery which became the largest winery in Sonoma county at that time.

Keynote speeches will be presented by Amy Ijichi Mori, grandniece of Kanaye Nagasawa, and Professor Robert Eberhart of Santa Clara University.

Attendees include: the Consul General of Japan in San Francisco, Dean of International and Extended Studies of San Jose State University, and students and academia from 15 Japanese universities. Studentled presentations on the future of the wine industry, with regards to the economy, new technology, food and health, education, and international collaboration will also be presented.
